Legalise pot, says a Liberal leader

POT smoking should be made legal, Lord Beaumont of Whitley said last night.

Lord Beaumont president-elect of the Liberal Party, said it was no more harmful than taking alcohol.

But he told Young Liberals in London that recommendations by a Home Office committee that penalties for pot smoking should be cut were "inconceivable in their Idiocy."

BRITAIN has no intention of easing her immigration restrictions to take in extra Asians forced out of East Africa.

Home Secretary James Callaghan is making this clear in private talks with Commonwealth leaders now meeting in London.

Mr. Callaghan insists that if Britain is forced to take more Asians from Kenya and Uganda, there will be a cutdown on other Commonwealth immigrants,

The Home Secretary is giving the Premiers the strongest warning yet of serious trouble in Britain if extra migrants have to be accepted.

He is telling them that many Britons share the views of Tory MP Mr. Enoch Powell, who wants to stop further immigration and encourage migrants to go home.
